All works must be original, and completed on or later than January 1, 2016.</p> <p>Entries in the following media will be accepted: painting, watercolor, drawing, mixed media, printmaking, ceramics, sculpture, carving, textile, glass, wood, metal work, photography. Two-dimensional work must not exceed 3' in width &amp; 3' in height, and must be ready for exhibition and ready to hang by wire. Work to be hung must not be over 15 pounds. Entries requiring ceiling hanging will not be accepted. Textiles may be larger if they can be folded for display. Three-dimensional work must not exceed 5 feet in any direction or weigh more than 100 pounds. Depending on size, they will be placed on pedestals or on the floor for display. All work must be labeled with the artist's name, title, short description, &amp; price. The HCAC screening/registration panel will serve as the final authority on eligibility. All art is expected to be displayed throughout the length of the Fine Arts Show. Work submitted should be considered for general viewing audiences of all ages.</p> | <p>A 20% commission is to be paid to the HCAC by the artist for each sale by April 14, 2018. Commission checks should be mailed to HCAC, PO Box 624, Romney, WV 26757.</p> <p><b>Judge</b><br/>We are extremely pleased to have Dot Procter of Bethesda, Maryland as our judge for the 2018 Spring Fine Art Show. Dot's primary media is acrylic on canvas but she supplements this with the use of tempera, watercolor, and occasionally oils. She loves using collage in her work and finds that acrylics work best. She enjoys drawing utilizing pencil, ink, charcoal, pastels (both oil and chalk) and markers. Rounding up her experience is the use of paper mache, wood, air-dry clay, fabric and recycled materials. In her words, "Nothing is off limits."<br/>"My first real art education came from my mother and grandmother who were both artists. They taught me that art is fun, important and healing." Dot received a BA degree from Lake Forest College in Illinois with continuing education at the Mass College of Art &amp; Design and the Yellow Barn Studio in Glen Echo, MD. Color is the primary passion that drives Dot in her work and teaching. This passion comes in handy while teaching children and teens with the goal of keeping their "art spark" burning brightly. Dot teaches adults in an Open Studio format allowing students to work side by side with other artists who are stretching their own limits of creativity.<br/>Dot has been honored with many special invitations to display her work with the list including The Byrne Gallery, Art Galley of Potomac, Glen Echo Park, Edison Gallery and Dover Public Library. Presently her work is displayed at the Bridge St. Gallery, South Dartmouth, MA and the Gallery Wright in Wilmington, VT. Of equal satisfaction to Dot is the inclusion of her work in public art collections such as the MD Anderson Cancer Center and Wellness Center in Houston, TX, the American Sport Fishing Association in Alexandria, VA, Collier, Shannon, Rill &amp; Scott in DC, Indigo Landing Restaurant, Alexandria, and Woodside Pediatrics in MD and DC as well as in private art collections in the US, several European countries, and Singapore.
